So Help Me God: The usual absceration imprecation affixed in modern times to oaths, and meaning, "<u>May God so help me as I keep this now."</u>

Smitten Builder: The old lecturer used to say: "The veil of the Temple is rent," the builder is smitten, and we are raised from the tomb of transgression .: " Hutchinson and after him Oliver, apply the expression, "The smitten builder," to the crucified our Savior, and define it as a symbol of his Divine mediation; but the general interpretation of th4ee symbol is, that it refers to death as the necessary precursor of immortality. In this sense, the smitten builder presents, like every other part of the Third Degree, the symbolic instruction of Eternal Life.

Manu: By reference to the Book of the Dead, it will be found that this word covers an ideal space corresponding to the word west in whose bosom is received the setting sun.


