SOME WELL-KNOW MASONS – Throughout the years, many well-know men have belonged to the Masonic Fraternity. The list begins with the Masonic Presidents: George Washington, James Monroe, Andrew Jackson, James Buchanan, Andrew Johnson, James Garfield, William McKinley, Theodore Roosevelt, William Taft, Warren Harding, Franklin D. Roosevelt, Harry S. Truman, Lyndon Johnson and Gerald Ford.

**FROM THE HISTORIAN:**

To paraphrase Richard E. Fletcher, PGM Grand Lodge of Vermont, “The real truth of the matter is we have come to depend on the ritual as the basis for Masonic knowledge. The Ritual does not make Masons; it makes members. A candidate is left hanging at the end of the 3<sup>rd</sup> Degree and has heard a lot of words without really knowing what they mean. Until the Degrees are explained to the new Mason he has little idea of just what he has gone through”.

The ritual has a very important place in the life of the new brother but it is not the end point from which there is no more to learn. However, we tend to be far more comfortable in working the degrees than in working with the new Brother to teach him what our beautiful craft is all about, where and when did it begin, and delving further into the history and symbolism of the degrees.

The “where and when” would seem to be the simplest but we (and multiple others) can (and do) only theorize what, in fact, may have happened. Freemasonry obviously did not begin with the forming of the Grand Lodge in London in 1717. This was a consolidation of existing lodges so there must have been some history before that date but we just don't know. For the Operative Mason, stone working dates back to before 6500 B.C. Stonehenge and the Egyptian pyramids date to 2600-2400 B.C. The Romans may have introduced the arch around 400 B.C. The English Guilds in the 10<sup>th</sup> century A.D. left Constitutions dealing with work rules, pay practices and rules of general conduct for the craft. And why would a Guild of workers in stone need such an elaborate system of recognition (signs, passwords, etc.)? How do you keep secret the methods of building a large structure when it is on display daily for all to observe? In the coming months, we will explore one or more of these areas (conduct of the Lodge, symbolism, history or ritual) at each stated communication when degrees are not being worked. The topic to be presented will be noted in the monthly Trestle board and Brothers are solicited for suggestions on subjects to be pursued.
